Here, our Christian faith calls us to practice accompaniment. In our BECs and neighbourhoods, we are invited to notice those who may be lonely or isolated. A simple visit to an elderly neighbour, bringing a copy of the parish bulletin or the Herald to a homebound, offering a listening ear, or helping with daily needs can become powerful signs of God's love. In these small acts of care and attention, the **Holy Spirit works through us to remind others that they are not forgotten or alone.**

The Holy Spirit is a real person who loves and cares for us. He strengthens us in times of trial and encourages us when we feel weak, just as He strengthened the apostles in their mission. Through the Holy Spirit, Jesus continues to be present in every generation and in every personal situation.

Faith also unites us with one another. Through faith, we are no longer orphans but brothers and sisters in Christ. Our natural longing to belong finds its ultimate fulfilment in God's glorious family, which begins here on earth in the community of believers and will be perfected one day in Heaven. ✚
