Micah 5: 1-4

Psalm 79: 2-3, 15-16, 18-19

Hebrews 10: 5-10

Luke 1: 39-45

Two mothers-to-be meet, and the child in Elizabeth's womb leaps for joy. Here I am, Lord, I come to do your Will. This is what Jesus wants us to imitate Him. To do the Will of the Father, totally and unconditionally. His Mother sets the pace when she answers the angel and says, 'I am the Handmaid of the Lord, let it be done to me, according to thy Will.'
