**SCRIPTURE**

Wisdom 9: 13-18  
Psalm 89: 3-6, 12-14, 17  
Philemon 9-10, 12-17  
Luke 14: 25-33

Many human activities have contributed to the destruction of Creation. These destructive acts such as excessive extraction and consumption, deforestation, pollution, wasting, and producing greenhouse gases which are heating the planet to dangerous levels – these are akin to acts of violence and war against all of Creation. “The earth was filled with violence” (Gen 6:11).

Isaiah 32:14-18, however, envisions a peaceful Creation where God’s people live when justice is achieved. Righteousness leads to peace and restores the land. Only through reconciliation with and genuine justice for all living beings will Creation find peace.

Each year there is a theme and for Year 1 (1 Sept 2025 – 31 Aug 2026), the theme is: Regenerate Hope for Flora and Fauna. Regeneration is part of Reconciliation with creation and a key element of Resilience.

Today’s Responsorial Psalm reminds us that we are like grass. The Gospel tells us to renounce our possessions in order to be Christ’s disciples. Both underlie the premise of not being attached to the material comforts of this world. **While there are people who lack even the most basic necessities, those who can afford it are addicted to a lifestyle that feeds an endless cycle of consumption and waste** perpetuating an inequitable system of distribution of resources. We are not prepared to make even small sacrifices and suffer small inconveniences like giving up meat twice a week, refusing single-use plastics, saving water, or making compost from food waste.

This Season of Creation, let us reconcile with Creation and with the Creator of all Creation. Let us commit to living out the hope that we, human beings, can indeed be the loving stewards and shepherds we were always called to be.✚
